History, Governance, and Staff

Founded in the early 1970s and incorporated as a tax-exempt nonprofit organization in 1979, Turningpoint is governed by a 5-7 member volunteer board of directors and led by a full-time executive director, who supervises seven additional full-time staff.

Approximately 20 staff provide victim/survivor support, retail, and administrative services.

Success Story

"Mary" is a single mother of a 15 year-old daughter, "Zoe," and an eight year-old son, "Trey," who is on the autism spectrum. Mary had been struggling to make ends meet after her abusive husband took everything and left. Because she was unable to pay the rent and support her two children on one income, Mary was evicted from her apartment. She and her two children had been living out of her car for about three months.

Mary saw a Turningpoint brochure at a local business. She contacted the crisis hotline. She was immediately connected to a caring, compassionate advocate. Her family was welcomed into shelter that same day.

Mary was extremely grateful to discover Turningpoint's newly renovated shelter now offers private bathrooms and kitchenettes in each room. With Trey's special needs, it was a relief to know they would have privacy as they acclimated to their new surroundings.

During her first meeting with her primary advocate, Mary learned her family was eligible for Rapid Re-Housing services. Over the next few weeks, Turningpoint's Rapid Re-Housing team helped Mary apply for housing and find an apartment she could afford. Gifts from generous donors allowed us to provide Zoe and Trey with preventative dental care, purchased groceries for the family, covered the cost of modest repairs to Zoe's car, and assisted with some legal filing fees for her divorce from her husband. Mary also received vouchers from the staff to shop at Turningpoint's Second Chances Thrift Store for furnishings for their home.


Mary was grateful to move her family into their new apartment last month. Mary continues to receive one-on-one emotional support from her primary advocate. She is navigating the legal system and her divorce with the support of Turningpoint advocate team and volunteer attorneys. She is optimistic about her future and very grateful.

Mary and her two children are just three of 622 people who created safety, stability, and strength this past year with Turningpoint services, thanks to your support.

Funding Sources


Turningpoint's typical operating budget is approximately \$1M. Funding is derived from government grant contracts; support from corporations, foundations, and local businesses; individual donors; faith-based and service organizations; the United Way St. Croix and Red Cedar Valleys; and earned revenue from Second Chances Thrift Store.

A Home for the Whole Family - Shelter Renovation Campaign

Turningpoint is in the final stages of our **A Home for the Whole Family** shelter renovation campaign!

All eight Turningpoint shelter bedrooms now offer private bathrooms and kitchenettes. Shelter bedrooms are pet-inclusive, and three ground-level suites offer pet doors to exterior pet relief areas.

Additional facility improvements include an elevator; renovated communal living room, kitchen and dining room, and children's playroom; a fitness room; a separate service provider entrance and meeting space; improved staff workspaces and client meeting spaces; expanded laundry facilities; and improved storage. Future improvements include a new shelter roof, new siding, and furnishings.
